It is a great honor, and I am thrilled to present, Volume 14, Issue 1 of the Colorado Technology Law Journal.

This Issue contains essays, articles, and a keynote address from truly distinguished intellectuals in the field of telecommunications and competition policy. It reflects the efforts of the fifteenth annual Silicon Flatirons Digital Broadband Migrations Conference, "First Principles for a Twenty First Century Innovation Policy," hosted at Colorado Law School on February 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2015. There, an amazing group gathered to answer, in large part, this question: How can we ensure that innovation will *drive* the expansion of our communications networks for generations to come? The articles and essays presented here grapple with the correct role of regulation, and the theories used by regulators, in creating a fair platform for such innovation and expansion.

FCC Chairman Tom Wheeler's Keynote Address calls us to action and articulates the FCC's framework for ensuring access, fairness, and innovation in our Internet ecosystem. Professor Morton reminds us that there is something distinct about an "industry regulator" worth remembering as we engage in this conversation. Jon Nuechterlein and Christopher Yoo illustrate that regulators must carefully consider whether existing regulatory concepts—here, the terminating access monopoly—always apply to new technologies. FTC Commissioner Maureen Ohlhausen explains how institutional design translates directly into successful and sustainable policy outcomes. Jon Sallet explores the relationship between communications regulation and antitrust, showing that they complement each other and together can produce regulatory synergy. Christopher Yoo shows us that while we can assume constant change in technology, we cannot always continue to assume the rate or direction of that change, even if we have created a "law" for it.

This Issue is also significant because many of us on the Journal have worked or interned for one of the authors or their organizations. It is an honor for us to publish their scholarship after having the chance to work with them. We feel lucky to be part of a community that cares deeply about these issues and is dedicated to continually improving knowledge in this field.

I am very proud to present three student notes in this issue. Bill Gillespie, Molly Hogan, and Spencer Rubin continue the tradition of outstanding student writing by members of our Journal. Each of their notes explores topics central to the ecosystem of innovation that was the subject of the Conference.
